Dr. Aiken Morgan is a clinical geropsychologist and an assistant professor at North Carolina A&T State University, where she is the director of the Biobehavioral Research on Aging, Cognition, and Health (BRACH) Lab. She holds an appointment as a visiting research fellow in the Center on Health and Society at the Social Science Research Institute at Duke University, and she is also a senior fellow in the Duke University Center for the Study of Aging and Human Development.

Her research interests lie at the intersection of four broad areas: sociocultural experience, cognition, aging, and health/health disparities. Her research examines the influence of social and health disparities on cognitive aging in African American adults and has two main areas of focus: 1) To examine how individual differences in social and health factors influence cognitive aging across the lifespan in African Americans; 2) To develop and implement physical and cognitive health interventions to improve cognitive function and prevent cognitive decline and incipient dementia in African American communities.
