My only concern with Playposit is their privacy policy. Through consent, Playposit allows for your information to be shared with third party companies, something that concerns me as an educator when it comes to the privacy of my students. I think there are some pros for their interactive ability to engage students, but I also think that you should take a look at and scrutinize the privacy policy concerns as well.
